Whereas the area specified below is considered by the State Government to be of adequate ecological, faunal, floral, geomorphological, natural and zoological significance for the purpose of protecting, propagating and developing wildlife and its environment.

Whereas Collector of District Patiala have issued proclamation under section 21 of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 for inviting claims, if any, in sanctuary area falling in his jurisdiction.

Whereas no claims to rights in sanctuary area have been received by the Collector Patiala as required under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 26-A of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 (Amended upto 1993) and in continuation of Punjab Government Forests Department Notification No. 34(39) Ft-4-87/5065 dated 3-3-89, the Governor of Punjab is pleased to declare the area specified below to be a Wildlife Sanctuary for the purpose of protecting, propagating and developing wildlife and its environment from the date of issue of this notification in the official gazette.
